Patrick also asked to please start thinking about possible candidates for President-Elect. If you know of anyone interested, please speak with Patrick. Also, the secretary and LAC office will be up for election. Please consider serving as an officer for our organization.

President-Elect, Dale English was not able to attend the meeting as well. Dale provided an update and communicated this to Karen. In regards to the needs assessment, Dale is currently working to finalize individuals for this committee. At this time, he only has one volunteer and would like to once again put a request out for volunteers. Dale is looking for a good cross section of AASHP members including new practitioners, mid-career practitioners, directors, students, and senior practitioners. This group will meet mainly through email correspondence and probably one teleconference to finalize our local needs assessment survey (5-10 minutes in length at most). Past President, Karen Eckley discussed that the board was submitting to change scholarship opportunities. Previously, the scholarship was geared to pharmacists seeking PharmD degrees or BCPS certification. This new reformed scholarship will be geared at students in pharmacy school. The finalized scholarship form was distributed to the membership. We are asking that the membership review the form and please contact Patrick with any suggestions/ improvements. Applications will be accepted from February 1st to April 15th. The recipient will be presented at the May meeting.

Treasurer, Mary Hailer reported that we are in good shape. The savings account has a balance of 11,370.77 and the checking account has a balance of 7239.91 for a total of 18, 610.68 but we will be paying for tonight's dinner. Mary also briefly reviewed the year end finances (as she was unable to attend the September meeting), and pointed out that our checking account had at least a \$4000 cushion thanks to Karen Eckley for all her efforts and hard work on the mini-expo.

Secretary, Holly Toukonen introduced several guests including: Julie Rose (student of Mary Hailer), potential new member Tom Stewart, Claudia Stephan and Larry Frazee who both rejoined, and technicians Shannon Groves, Linda Gradyan, Tamera Walls, Rachelle Raybuck, Portia Haller, Sandy Kaltenborn, Pattie Finelli, Marybeth Snyder, Sue Burton, and Michelle Corn.

Lou Barone (LAC Representative) reminded us that the OSHP residency showcase will be November 7th at Crown Plaza. Lou then introduced Sara Welch (SSHP student representative) who gave us an update on NEOUCOP. She introduced Eric Tuttle who was also present. Sara stated that SSHP had its first meeting on September 25th with an excellent turnout--65% of the classes signed up. Thursday, October 15th, there will be a clinical skills competition--12 teams originally signed up. There will likely be less teams competing due to

media coverage and the presentation of a \$750 donation to Free Clinic from funds that were raised at a faculty auction. On October 25th, SSHP will be cleaning up a section of highway (ODOT project) and will have a cookout afterwards. Sara reminded us that the November meeting will be a joint venture with SSHP and student posters will be available for viewing. They are excited to be co-hosting this event.

Take the Ohio Turnpike to Exit 193. Follow State Route 44 south past Ravenna and into Rootstown. NEOUCOM is on the right.

From the South Taking I-77:

Take I-77 north to I-76 east. Follow I-76 through Akron to exit 38A. Turn right off the exit onto State Route 44 south. NEOUCOM is on the right.

From Central/Southwest Ohio Taking I-71:

Take I-71 north to I-76 east. Follow I-76 through Akron to exit 38A. Turn right off the exit onto State Route 44 south. NEOUCOM is on the right.

From the North Taking I-480:

Take I-480 east and continue on State Route 14 through Streetsboro. Take State Route 44 south past Ravenna and into Rootstown. NEOUCOM is on the right.

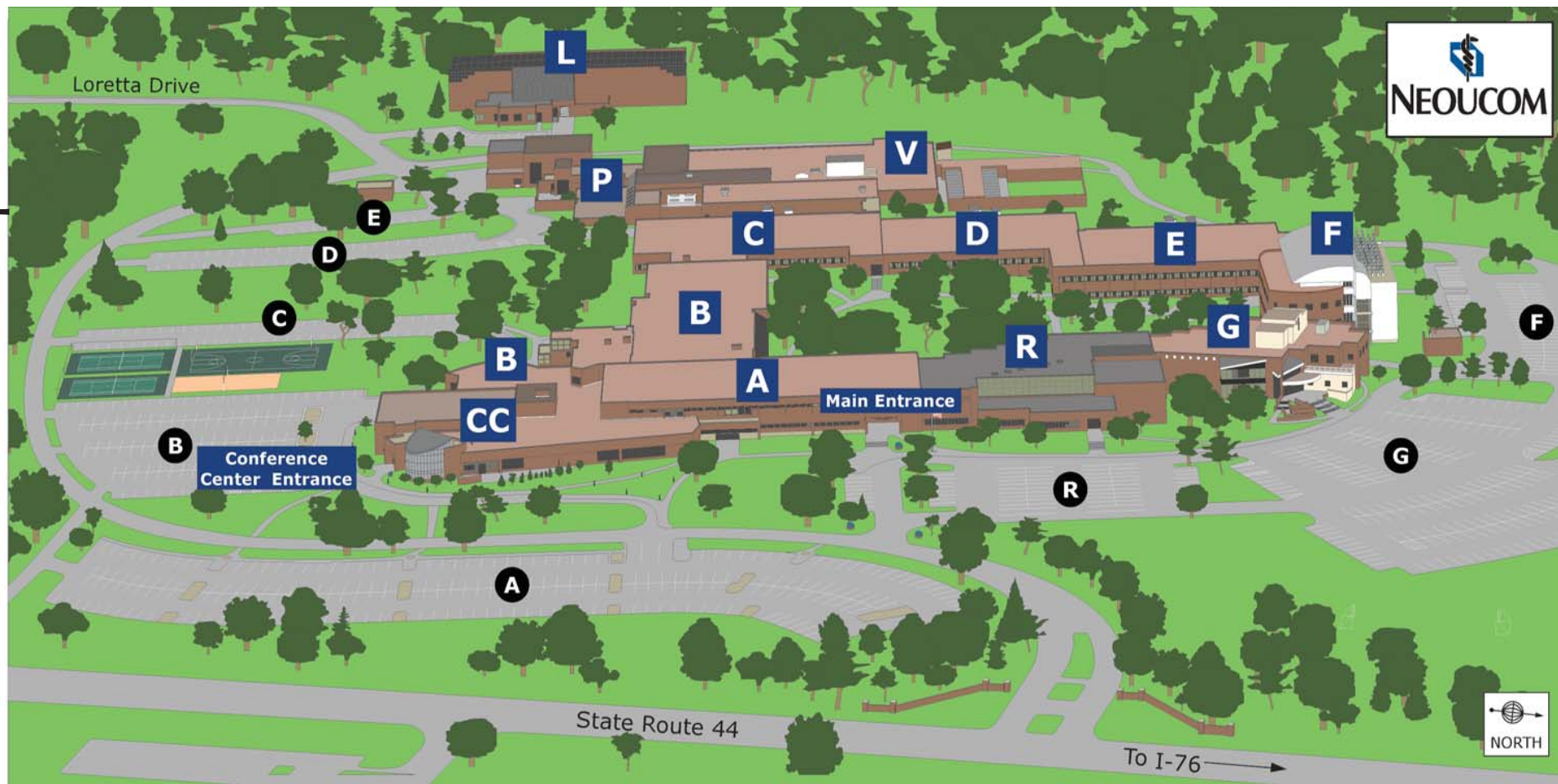
From the East Taking I-76:
